


2 Invitations from our Neighbors

This elegantly-styled showpiece is truly a one-of-a-kind car, directly from the Mercedes factory's own Sindelfingen Werk, which was custom designed and built for William A. M. Burden, great, great grandson of Cornelius Vanderbilt.

The Jaffe family obtained the car in 1963, from the vehicle's second owner, in Kew Gardens, Queens. The car was completely disheveled, but the engine was still in working condition. After pumping air into the tires, and for a \$25 rope tow, the Jaffe family brought it to Plainview.

The complete restoration project took over 23 years to complete, and there was a 100 point restoration done by a small company in Indiana, to the point of authenticity.

There must be immense satisfaction when Mr. Jaffe counts the many, many First Place trophies that are earned by the vehicle every year.

When I spoke with Mr. Jaffe, he on the high quality of the vehicle by saying that, "this is a such strong, quality car that you don't replace parts on it that go bad, but rather you rebuild the parts themselves."


